
* 5 Tips For Brushing Your Cat's Teeth



Get them used to touch.

Gently massage their chin and mouth area regularly prior to introducing the toothbrush. Offer lots of praise before, during and after.



Speaking of toothpaste...

Do not use human toothpaste on your cat. Only use a pet friendly version. There are many types of flavors available, even for the pickiest of cats.




Did we mention praise?

Offer continuous praise (we're talking cats, here) and provide treats as needed through the process. Start short and increase session length as your cat gets more comfortable.



Start with your finger.

Use a tiny bit of toothpaste on your finger first. Let them lick some off your finger to get used to the taste. Attempt a slow pass at their teeth and gums as allowed. (Praise excessively.) Once they are ok with this, attempt a finger brush or toothbrush.

Assume the position.

Find a position that is comfortable and non-threatening for your cat. This might be on your lap or kneeling behind them while they are on the ground.
